Empire Farm Days Set for August 6-8, 2019 at Rodman Lott & Son Farms, Seneca Falls, NY

Seneca Falls, NY. Rodman Lott and Son Farms in Seneca Falls, N.Y. will host the 2019 Empire Farm Days on August 6-8, 2019. The farm at 2973 Route 414 has hosted this 3-day event, the largest outdoor agricultural trade show in the Northeastern U.S., since 1988.

More than 65,000 production agriculture farmers, food producers, gardeners, and outdoor and rural life enthusiasts from the US and Canada attend Empire Farm Days.

This show brings all the latest agricultural technologies, tractors, farm implements, and dairy and farming industry innovations and services to one site along with educational seminars, working field demonstrations, live animal activities, and more than 600 exhibits.

The show is estimated to have an annual economic impact in excess of \$2.1 million on the Seneca County economy.

This event began in 1931 as an agricultural show organized by the Empire State Potato Growers. It was renamed as Empire Farm Days in 1967. Cornell University was the host site of the 1972, 1973, 1981, and 1982 Empire Farm Days.

Empire Farm Days show hours are 9 am-5 pm on Tuesday, August 6 and Wednesday, August 7, and 9 am-4 pm on Thursday, August 8. Parking is \$10 per vehicle. Learn more at www.empirefarmdays.com.
